Studies have found that teacher instructional coaching has a greater impact on instruction and student achievement than almost all other school-based intervention programs. Student performance improves with instructional coaching for teachers, regardless of if the teacher is a novice or a veteran (Kraft, Blazar, & Hogan, 2018).

NL works with over a dozen schools providing instructional coaching and support to teachers and school leaders. Our instructional coaches work with closely with teachers to help them develop expertise in areas where they would like to grow professionally.

Coaching can happen virtually or in-person, with one teacher at school or with all teachers. Rapport is the most important aspect of the coaching relationship, and is established through a series of virtual or in-person visits, which then lead to inclass observations, observation debrief sessions, and potentially co-teaching or modeling.
